Program Co-Chairs

Kara Brighton concentrates her practice on water and natural resources issues. She has worked for the State of Wyoming on issues related to *Nebraska v. Wyoming*. She currently represents the Wheatland Irrigation District, and previously assisted with the North Platte litigation settlement negotiations and implementation.

Thomas Davidson practices in the Denver office of his international firm. He has extensive experience as a litigator in both state and federal environmental law issues affecting Wyoming and the Rocky Mountain states. Prior to joining his firm, he served as Deputy Attorney General in the Division of Water and Natural Resources in the State of Wyoming.

She has experience working for the State of Wyoming on endangered species issues, National Forest management matters and water resources management. She has worked on the *Nebraska v. Wyoming* case, and has represented the Wyoming Stock Grower's Association, the Wyoming Wool Grower's Association and several timber companies.

John M. Burman is Of Counsel to the law firm of Corthell and King. He currently teaches law courses in Professional Responsibility and Torts. He previously served as Special Attorney and as Special Assistant Attorney General for the State of Minnesota.
