Program Chair

LeRoy W. Sievers joined his firm in January 2000 and has been practicing law for nearly 30 years. In 1984, he joined the Nebraska Attorney General's Office, where he represented the State in water resources, banking and appellate litigation. In 1991, he moved to the Nebraska Department of Water Resources, where he worked on the *Nebraska v. Wyoming* litigation in the U.S. Supreme Court concerning the North Platte River. He was the Lincoln Bar Association's President in 2000-2001.

Ann Bleed is the Deputy Director of the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources. She is also an adjunct faculty member of the School of Natural Resources at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Thomas V. Cech is the Executive Director of the Central Colorado Water Conservancy District. He is also the author of *Principles of Water Resources: History, Development, Management, and Policy*, 2nd Edition (Wiley, June 2004).

Michael Clements is the Manager of the Lower Republican River Natural Resources District in Alma. He and his District have broad responsibilities to protect Nebraska's natural resources and respond to local needs.

Jim Cook served as head legal counsel for the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources from that department's inception on July 1, 2000, until December 31, 2003. He is now "semi-retired" and continues to work for the department on a part-time basis. He remains active in the ongoing process to formulate a three-state/Department of Interior partnership to address endangered species issues in the Central Platte River Basin.

David Cookson is Special Counsel to the Nebraska Attorney General. He practices primarily in the areas of interstate water issues and environmental law. He has represented the State of Nebraska as lead counsel and as a negotiator in interstate water original actions before the U.S. Supreme Court, and has negotiated and structured successful settlements of two interstate original actions.

Ann Diers has been Legal Counsel to the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources since June 2004. Prior to joining the Department, she was engaged in private practice in Lincoln, Nebraska. Ms. Diers has practiced law for over 17 years in both the public and private sectors.

Jasper Fanning is the new manager of the Upper Republican Natural Resources District after having served as Temporary Interim Manager. He has a PhD in economics from Kansas State University.

James Goeke works with local agencies and individuals to identify, monitor and manage groundwater problems, assists in the development of groundwater supplies, defines and interprets regional geology, and conducts base line water quality studies with the Twin Platte Natural Resources District. He has been with the Conservation and Survey Division since 1976.

Michael Jess provides general direction to the CSD faculty and supervision of staff activities. His efforts are aimed at creating awareness of and soliciting input for the Conservation and Survey Division and School of Natural Resource Sciences. He is involved in creating a curriculum devoted to effective local self-government of natural resources. He was Director of the Nebraska Department of Water Resources from 1981 to 1999.

Michael C. Klein has been engaged in the general practice of law in Holdrege with his firm since 1977. His practice includes the representation of clients concerning water and water rights.

Roger K. Patterson was appointed as Director of the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources by Governor Mike Johanns in January 1999. He previously spent 25 years with the Bureau of Reclamation, Department of Interior, working in several of the western states. In 1995, he was honored with the Presidential Rank Distinguished Executive Award, the highest award bestowed on a federal career employee.

Daniel Smith was hired as Assistant Manager for the Middle Republican NRD in March 1979 and became the Manager in August 1999. He previously served in the United States Air Force as a copilot on B-52s for 5 years.

Duane Woodward focuses on surface water and ground water studies. The Platte River Cooperative Hydrology Study (COHYST) requires much of his time as he works with others to develop the groundwater database and Regional Groundwater Models for the Platte River Area above Columbus, Nebraska. Other hydrology work includes high groundwater investigations and storm water runoff from precipitation events.
